### **Entry Procedure:**

Entries must be made on-line, mailed or hand delivered. Entries will not be accepted by fax or e-mail. Entry forms may be photocopied or downloaded from our web site:

**Note:** Each Livestock Exhibitor must complete a separate entry form per species, club association, market & breeding.

### **Entry Rules:**

### **Online Entry Procedure:**

Online entries will be accepted from January 15, 2010 through April 24, 2010 at 2 p.m. Late entries will not be accepted online and must be delivered to the Sacramento County Fair Office at Cal Expo. *see below for details*

### **Entry Guidelines**

1. Entries will not be accepted by fax or e-mail.
2. Late entries will be accepted for just cause until April 30<sup>th</sup>, 5:00 p.m. A \$5.00 penalty fee per item and/or class entered must be paid in addition to the entry fee.
3. Full entry fees must accompany all entries. Entries without paid fees will not be accepted.
4. Entry fees are non-refundable. Entry fees for exhibits that are withdrawn or not displayed by the exhibitor will not be refunded. Calculate fees carefully. Overpayments due to calculation errors will not be refunded.
5. A \$35.00 processing fee will apply to all or any checks not honored by the bank.
6. Please be sure all forms are filled out clearly and completely. Incomplete entry forms or forms that cannot be

read will not be accepted.

7. Fair Management reserves the right to limit exhibits to facilities available and may limit the number of exhibits made by an exhibitor.
8. Fair Management reserves the right to return entries, cancel any division or class, or combine divisions and classes in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.
9. A complete exhibit eligible in more than one division and/or class shall be entered and judged in the division and/or class for which it best qualifies. Fair management reserves the right to make this determination.

### **Classes & Eligibility**

**Junior livestock competitions are open to Sacramento County residents only unless otherwise noted. FFA and 4-H members who live outside the county may participate if the chapter or headquarters of their organization lies within the Sacramento County boundaries.**

### **Junior Department Local Classes**

The Junior Livestock Show & Auction is available for young people to exhibit their animals in friendly competition. The exhibitor's age on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current program year will be used to determine eligibility unless otherwise noted.

### **Primary Information**

**Sacramento County Fair supports the 4-H philosophy and rules regarding competition and youth under 9 years of age.**

"Fairs are open to primary members for exhibit only. The use of Danish and American systems of judging is not acceptable for use with primary members. Primary members should only receive recognition for their participation." *4-H Policy Handbook, Section 400: 403.1 #10*

All Junior Livestock Exhibitors should fall into one of the following established classes:

### **FFA Members**

FFA members may exhibit at the Fair if they are enrolled in high school vocational agricultural classes. They may continue to exhibit as members for one full year following graduation.

### **4-H Members**

Any 4-H member who is under nine years-old but at

least five years-old on December 31st of the past year is invited to enter small animal showmanship classes (dog, rabbits, poultry, cavies, pygmy goats and Nigerian goats) as a non-competitive exhibitor. All exhibitors will receive a participation ribbon. 4-H uniforms may be worn in appropriate divisions.

Any 4-H member who is nine years-old or older on December 31st of the past year may exhibit as a 4-H member and participate in competitive 4-H classes, and may continue to do so until the end of the calendar year in which the member has his/her 19<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## Grange Members

Any Grange member who is under nine years-old but at least five years-old on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current fair year is invited to enter small animal showmanship classes (dog, rabbits, poultry, cavies, pygmy goats and Nigerian goats) as a non-competitive exhibitor. All exhibitors will receive a participation ribbon.

Any Grange member who is nine years-old or older on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current fair year may exhibit in competition as a Grange member until the end of the calendar year in which the member has his/her 19<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## Independent Junior Exhibitors

1. Youth not affiliated with 4-H, FFA, or Grange can exhibit in appropriate FFA or 4-H Livestock classes as Independent Junior Exhibitors, provided they meet the age or grade level requirements.
2. Fair management may establish separate animal classes for Independent Junior Exhibitors, provided there are a sufficient number of entries.
3. An Independent Junior Exhibitor can not have been a member of a junior organization within 60 days prior to the opening of the Fair in order to be eligible to participate (120 days for market beef cattle & horse). For any additional clarification, refer to State Rules.
4. Independent exhibitors must be at least 5 years old, but not older than 18, on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current program year.
5. Independent Exhibitors must provide proof of insurance coverage for their project. (See Liability Rule #4.)

The following age and ownership rules apply to *all livestock exhibition participants* at the Sacramento County Fair. Junior Livestock Exhibitors who are members of a club or organization must adhere to these rules *in addition* to the rules and guidelines set forth by their club or organization.

## Exhibitor Age Requirements for Livestock Exhibition:

1. **Market Classes** - Exhibitors must be 9 years old on

January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current fair year to exhibit any market animal (beef, lamb, hogs, rabbit, poultry, eggs and goat).

2. **Breeding Classes** - Exhibitors must be 9 years old on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current program year to exhibit breeding animals (all species).
3. Exhibitors must be 5 years old on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current program year to show dogs, cavies, poultry, rabbits, pygmy goats, Nigerian Dwarf Goats, and therapeutic animal projects (Showmanship only).
4. Rabbit & Cavy Exhibitors must be under 19 as of fair date in accordance with ARBA Show Sanction Rules.

## Ownership Requirements for Livestock Exhibition:

Listed below are the number of consecutive days the exhibitor must own his/her animal prior to the opening of the Fair. Fair management may demand such proof of ownership as necessary.

**Horses (leased or owned)**..... 120 days

## Uniforms

### FFA Uniform

The official FFA show uniform will be worn by all FFA exhibitors, helpers, and chapter groups while showing at the Sacramento County Fair. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing. Exhibitors showing cattle must wear boots and exhibitors showing horses must wear boots and helmets. No open toe shoes are allowed in the show ring.

### 4-H Uniform

Exhibitors and helpers will wear the official 4-H uniform; "All 4-H exhibitors must be in 4-H uniforms when showing their animals in 4-H divisions or be disqualified from the class. The official State 4-H Fair uniform for girls consists of white dress, white blouse and skirt or white blouse and slacks, the green collar or 4-H tie and the 4-H Club cap. The official boys' uniform consists of white, long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt, green 4-H tie, and the 4-H cap. All shirts/blouses must have a collar." No open-toed shoes are allowed in the show ring.

### Grange Uniform

Dark Blue denim pants; white long sleeved, button-front dress shirt with collar; the official red waist vest with Grange emblem on the back; black or brown belt with appropriate buckle. Exhibitors showing cattle must wear boots and exhibitors showing horses must wear boots and helmets. No open toe shoes are allowed in the show ring. Exhibitors in small animal species classes or still exhibits may wear closed toed black or brown

shoes with an enclosed heel. All Grange Youth Fair Program groups exhibiting at a local fair may agree, due to weather, to alter the shirt of this uniform to a short-sleeved white button front shirt (no sleeveless shirts). The waist vest shall be worn secured in the front. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official uniform while showing other than horses.

## Independent Junior Exhibitor's Uniform

Junior exhibitors shall wear clean, appropriate show ring attire that includes ankle length pants and a collared shirt. Exhibitors showing cattle must wear boots and exhibitors showing horses must wear boots and helmets. No open toe shoes are allowed in the show ring.

## Credentials

**Policy! Parking passes for exhibitors are now available at a rate of \$5/ day or \$25/ for a season pass valid for all 5 days of fair.**

**Note: The Fair does not supply free parking passes for exhibitors.**

### Additional parking pass pricing and availability:

1. Exhibitor vehicles may make deliveries prior to 8:30 a.m. on Thursday and Friday and must be in designated parking areas by 9:00 a.m. Deliveries on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday must be made before 9:00 a.m. and must be in designated parking areas by 9:30 a.m. Vehicles on grounds after these times will be towed. **All vehicles parked illegally will be towed away at the owner's expense!**
2. Parking passes will be available for purchase at special exhibitor rates from April 1st through May 20th, at the Fair Office.
3. Privileged on Fairgrounds (Levee Passes) Parking Passes are available at Sacramento County Fair Office on Saturday, April 24th, between 8:00 a.m. & 2:00 p.m. All parking passes will be issued in person, and no mailed, faxed or e-mail requests will be accepted. The on grounds parking pass is \$85.00 and space is available by size of vehicle on a first come, first served basis, and cannot be transferred between vehicles. For more information please call 916-263-2975. Every person in the vehicle must have an admission pass to enter the grounds.
4. There are a limited number of Privileged Reserved Passes available for exhibitors, leaders, or advisors with personal, physical mobility restrictions. (The same \$85.00 parking fee applies.) Please contact the fair manager for more information if you feel you may qualify for one of these spaces.

5. R.V. parking is available. Contact Cal Expo at 263-3040. Camping fees are \$35/night per trailer, camper, and motor home (with or without hook ups), with one unit per space. Each person will be assigned a specific numbered camping space. No refund on camping spaces. Limited hook ups are available. Every space sold must have adult supervision throughout the entire fair. The adult that signs the R.V. Registration Form will be held responsible for that space.
6. Parking for livestock trailers is available at no charge in Lot E. Enter Gate 10. No security will be provided.
7. All 4-H Community Leaders, FFA Advisors, Grange Coordinators and 4-H Leaders will be required to purchase parking passes.
8. No vehicle will be allowed on grounds before fair closes at 10:00 p. m. on Thursday through Sunday of Fair.

**Policy! A paid gate will be in effect at the 2010 Sacramento County fair. Gates will be monitored beginning at 6:00 a.m., May 27-31.**

9. All livestock exhibitors will receive a wristband allowing access to the fairgrounds. If lost, exhibitor will have to purchase a season pass credential.
10. Each livestock family will receive ten single admission passes.
11. 4-H Community Leaders and FFA Advisors will complete an admission credential list, to be submitted to the fair manager for approval by May 7th. Admission credentials will be available at the livestock office May 25 through May 26.
12. Exhibitor Credential Pricing: Season admission pass, good for all five days at any gate, \$10. Credentials will be available for purchase at discounted exhibitor rates May 1 through May 26 at the fair office.

## Liability

1. The owner or custodian of property of any kind brought to Cal Expo either for exhibit or for other purposes assumes as a condition of its admission to the grounds, all risk and/or responsibility for its loss, damage or theft.
2. The Fair, its officers and employees cannot and will not accept responsibility and liability for any damage or injury resulting from theft, fire, the elements, accidents or other conditions or causes; whether to exhibits, property of exhibitor, vehicles on the grounds and articles left therein or any other property of any nature whatsoever.
3. Exhibitors, either through appropriate liability insurance or other means satisfactory to the 52nd District Agricultural Association, will defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State of California, the Association and the Sacramento fair from any claim arising out of the failure of the exhibitor to exercise control of his or

her exhibit. Livestock exhibitor's parents or legal guardian are required to sign a disclaimer on the entry form.

4. All independent livestock exhibitors must provide certificate of general liability insurance (\$1,000,000 minimum) or purchase insurance through fair office (\$18 – small animal exhibitor/family, \$35 – large animal exhibitor/family).

## Livestock Exhibition Rules

### General Rules

1. The Sacramento County Fair is a smoke-free facility. Smoking will be permitted in designated areas only.
2. A responsible adult must be in attendance at all times in the livestock areas to represent each club, chapter or independent exhibitor participating in the livestock department. Failure to comply will also affect Herdsmanship award evaluation. For details on the Herdsmanship award program, please see Special Awards page.
3. No barbecuing or open fires in the Barn or Barn area at any time.
4. The possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs by any minor is prohibited on Cal Expo property and will result in immediate expulsion from the Fair and forfeiture of awards, premiums and monies received at auction.
5. Absolutely **NO PETS ALLOWED** in the barn area or on the fairgrounds. **Only animals entered in competitions are allowed on the fairgrounds!** Exceptions will be made for Service Animals on a leash. Dogs entered in the dog show are restricted to the show area.
6. Muzzles: No animals will be muzzled while on the fairgrounds.
7. All material and decorations used in an exhibit must be made from a nonflammable material or treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition.
8. Exhibit Buildings and the Livestock Pavilion will close and be secured at 8:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, 9:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday and 7:00 p.m. on Monday of fair.
9. No skateboards, motor scooters, motorbikes, roller blades, roller skates, bicycles, or golf carts, or similar personal wheeled devices will be allowed on the Cal Expo grounds other than those operated by Fair personnel.
10. Fair Management reserves the right to disqualify and/or remove any exhibit that is not in the best interest of the Fair, including any livestock exhibit which endangers the well being of the public or other animals while

at the Fair.

11. Exhibitors, Leaders, Advisors and Parents who violate these rules, or who are found to be involved in unethical or hostile practices with the fair, shall incur penalties that may include (but are not limited to) disqualification, removal from the Fair, forfeiture of awards and ineligibility in future Fair competitions.
12. The use of canes or show tubes in the show ring, on auction or load out day will not be allowed. Show slappers and similar approved show aids will be allowed

### Arrival

1. Load in of straw and tack can begin at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 25 and will end by 9:00 p.m. on that day.
2. Animals are entered at owner's risk! The Sacramento County Fair is not responsible for injury or death of any animal.

### During the Fair

1. Exhibitors must provide all bedding and feed— (wheat straw bedding only, no rice straw). No sprays of any kind on the straw will be allowed. Straw covering devices will be allowed and must be completely removed at the end of Fair. All straw covers must be maintained and kept clean at all times.
2. Junior Exhibitors are required to groom, care for, prepare for showing, and show their animals during the Fair.
3. When it is impossible for an exhibitor to show all his/her own animals, only another Junior Livestock Exhibitor with an animal being exhibited at the Sacramento County Fair is eligible to assist them. Except in case of excusable absence, the exhibitors must be present in the ring with animals for both show and sale unless prior arrangements have been made with the Fair CEO/Fair Manager.
4. 4-H Project leaders, FFA Advisors and parents may provide instruction **only**. Other adults and non-exhibiting juniors are prohibited from assisting any junior exhibitor without permission from the Fair CEO/Fair Manager.
5. Barn aisles, pens, alleyways and tie outs must be clean & clear no later than 8:00 a.m. each morning, including Monday. All rakes, scoops, shovels, wheelbarrows, hoses, etc. must be put away no later than 8:00 a.m. each morning. No clean-out on Auction Day in L1. If pens are cleaned, the straw must be dumped in the manure runs. No equipment will be in L1.

### End of the Fair

1. **All exhibits & displays must remain in place un-**

**til release time, 7:00 p.m. on Monday, May 31, unless otherwise stated.**

2. Issue of written releases will occur at 7:00 p.m. Monday, May 31, prior to departure from fairgrounds. Removal of stock, or early dismantling of barn displays will be cause for forfeiture of all monetary awards won by the individual and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances. Removal of tack or display will result in disqualification in Herdsmanship.

## Judging & Awards

1. The judges may disqualify or transfer to the correct division (at his/her discretion) any exhibit that is not a true representative of the division or class in which it is entered.
2. If there is only one animal in a class, it will be up to the judge's discretion to award first place to that animal in Registered Breeding Classes. Feeder animals who make market weight cannot show in a market class, they must remain in a feeder class and will not be eligible for auction. If less than five entries are entered in a class, Fair Management reserves the right to combine classes to insure proper competition.
3. For classes that combine 4-H, FFA, Grange and Independent Junior animals, the judge will designate only one overall highest placing animal, i.e. Champion or Reserve Champion, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex.
4. Checks for monetary awards won will be mailed to the address recorded on the exhibitor's entry form. Be sure your name and address are correct and clearly written on your entry forms. All FFA monetary awards will be mailed to the FFA advisor.
5. Checks become void after 90 days from the date of issue. Requests for checks to be reissued will be subject to a \$35 handling fee. Requests for a check to be reissued after 18 months will be denied.
6. All ribbons will be awarded at time of judging.
7. The judge's decision on awards cannot be protested. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. All protests must be presented to Management of the Fair in writing within 24 hours of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit (cash, money order, or certified check), or \$200.00 if the protest relates to a violation of State Rules X-XI, which will be returned if the protest is determined valid. Protests and appropriate action are decided by the Fair Management/Fair Board of Directors. If protests cannot be resolved with

the Board of Directors, the Division of Fairs and Expositions may intervene.

## Showmanship

*Showmanship and Master Showmanship Awards are sponsored by the Sacramento County Fair Board of Directors.*

### Definition or terms:

**4- H Novice** - 1st year showing this specie

**FFA Novice/Greenhand** - 1st year showing this specie in FFA regardless of prior affiliation

## Small & Large Animal Showmanship

See Schedule of Events for dates & times.

1. To be eligible all animals (with the exception of horses, see rule #1 in *Light Horse and Pony*) must be owned by the exhibitor and have been fitted, entered, and shown in an individual livestock class other than Showmanship by the exhibitor. (Exception: primary showmanship)
2. The first and second place winners in 4-H Junior Novice and 4-H Senior Novice may advance to the next class. (Novice denotes a first time exhibitor of any species).
3. First place winners in the 4-H Junior & Senior Classes are to compete in Master Showmanship Contest.
4. All exhibitors are required to wear the official show uniform of the organization they represent, as designated by the Sacramento County Fair.
5. Youth (ages 5-8 years) are not eligible for competitive Showmanship.

## Small & Large Animal Master Showmanship

See schedule of Events for dates & times.

1. The Fair will furnish all animals for Master Showmanship.
2. Winners from Beef, Sheep, Dairy Cattle, Horse, Swine, Dairy Goat, Boer /Market /Fiber Goat Showmanship will compete in Large Animal Master Showmanship.
3. Winners from Poultry, Rabbit, Dog, Pygmy Goat, Nigerian Goat, and Cavies Showmanship will compete in Small Animal Master Showmanship.
4. Each first place winner in FFA and 4-H Junior and Senior Classes will compete in Master Showmanship.
5. All first place showmanship winners in FFA & 4-H Junior and Senior classes are required to participate. If an exhibitor wins more than one showmanship, they must choose their qualifier. **The highest placing 4-H**

or FFA exhibitor from the other showmanship then qualifies for Master Showmanship.

- 6. 4-H Junior Master Showmanship winners must move up to Senior Competition the following year.
- 7. If an exhibitor qualifies for both Large and Small Animal Master Showmanship, the candidate must choose large, or small. They cannot compete in both, as these competitions are at the same time.
- 8. FFA and 4-H Senior Master Showmanship winners may qualify for and compete in Senior Master Showmanship again.

**California State Fair Best of Show  
Master Showmanship**

The California State Fair Best of Show Competition is open to exhibitors winning the Master Showmanship or Round Robin Showmanship in large and small animal competitions at their County, District or Citrus Fair. Classes are offered in Large Animal Livestock Showmanship and in Small Animal Showmanship. Entries will be judged using the American system of Judging. Special State Fair Rosettes will be awarded to all participants. To obtain a premium book, entry form and further information contact:

**General Information:**

- 1. Herdsman judging will occur during the Sacramento County Fair, at least two times per day at unannounced times.
- 2. Awards for any club are at the discretion of the judge.
- 3. Do not remove signs and displays prior to 7:00 p.m. on Monday, the last day of the Fair. Stalls left in an untidy condition will result in the disqualification of the club or chapter responsible.
- 4. Any Club/Chapter group or individual scoring an average of less than 65% in the Herdsmanship Competition will be disqualified from competition.
- 5. Judges will select two winners. from the following categories:
  - 4-H Club
  - FFA Chapter
- 6. Winners of Horse Herdsmanship will receive a \$50 check from the Sacramento County Fair.
- 7. Sacramento County Fair reserves the right to not award Herdsmanship where our criteria is not met.

## General Rules

**Extra Stalls will be limited to Clubs.**

**Limited Stall Space available for tack & storage.**

1. All horses must be owned or leased by exhibitor, a minimum of 120 days prior to the Fair. Exhibitors of leased horses must have filed a copy of the lease agreement signed by the owner and exhibitor with Fair Management, including a clear side view picture or some permanent identification, a minimum of 120 days prior to the start of the Fair.
2. All horses owned by the exhibitor must show proof of ownership at check-in. All registration papers for horses entered in the Light Horse Division must be checked in at the Horse Show Office. See schedule of events for date and time. Failure to do so may eliminate the entry from competition. Registered horses must show *original* (not copy) papers. Any horse or equine must be solely owned or leased by the exhibitor showing the animal or owned by the exhibitor's parent, step-parent, sibling, half-sibling, step-sibling, grandparent, step-grandparent, or legal guardian (as evidenced by court documents). Horses owned in the name of a family ranch are also acceptable. Grade horses must have ownership form on file or show bill of sale.
3. Class divisions are determined by exhibitor's age as of *January 1, 2010*. Junior Division entries must be ages 9-13 years old, Senior Division entries must be 14 years or older.
4. Each 4-H or FFA exhibitor must be signed up with a

leader/advisor in a definite project or class.

5. Each exhibitor may bring a maximum of 2 horses; only one can be entered in riding classes. The second animal must be a weanling, a yearling, or a miniature equine and must be entered in In-Hand classes and/or Miniature Equine classes as appropriate.
6. All exhibits must be maintained throughout the five days of the fair. *No horse or pony may be removed from the grounds before the specified time of release on Monday evening.*

## Barn & Arena Procedures

1. All horses must remain in the Barn or Show Arena area.
2. All horses must be hand led from Stalls to the Show Arena. No horse may be ridden between these areas. Horses may not be ridden within the Barn areas, only in designated warm-up areas and the arenas.
3. No riding with lead ropes and halters at any time. *Exhibitors must wear boots when riding or handling horse/pony. No "riding style" tennis shoes permitted.*
4. Halters must remain available at stall at all times while horse is in stall.
5. No longeing, with the exception of inside the Cavalcade Arena and only at designated times. *Longeing will be permitted only with adult supervision . . . no free longeing.*
6. Barn aisles and stalls must be clean and cleared not later than 8:00 a.m. each morning. All rakes, scoops,

wheelbarrows, hoses, etc. must be put away not later than 8:00 a.m. each morning.

7. Please wash your horse only once and only within the designated wash rack areas. *Boots must be worn.*
8. Each club and/or chapter must be responsible for adult supervision in the practice arena by barn assignments. See posted charts in the Horse Show Office. Each club, chapter and/or independent exhibitor must also provide adult supervision in its barn area at all times.
9. **Safety Helmets:** Helmet Rule (based upon California 4-H Equestrian Helmet Policy), effective July 1, 1994 – all youth and adults participating in any 4-H equestrian activity, regardless of riding seat, shall wear a properly fitted equestrian helmet that meets ASTM/SEI approval with secured chin harness properly fastened at all times when mounted on an equine or in a vehicle being pulled by one or more equines.
10. No open fires, camp stoves, or barbecues allowed in the barn area, parking lot, or grandstand by order of the State Fire Marshall. *No smoking in barns or barn areas at any time!*
11. Absolutely no dogs are allowed in the barn areas or on the Fairgrounds at any time with the exception of guide dogs for the blind.
12. No bareback jumping allowed.

### Equipment & Attire

1. Horses must be shown in an approved Western bit (including snaffle or bosal hackamore) in all Western Performance classes. No mechanical hackamores, pencil bosals, tie-downs, martingales, or draw reins allowed. Approved English bits must be used in English Performance classes. Running or standing martingales are not permitted in Hunter Hack or flat English classes but may be used in jumping classes. Boots and bandages are not permitted except in Reining patterns, Jumpers, and Gymkhana classes. Equipment must be all Western or English, not mixed. Use of silver equipment and/or appointments is not to count over clean attire and tack in good condition.
2. Horses must remain in the same bridle/bit throughout a division. No changes allowed. Changes may be made, however, when switching from one division to another, i.e. Western, English, and Gymkhana.
3. **Attire:** In all performance classes helmets, long-sleeved shirts or jackets, and boots are required. Do not mix Western and English attire and tack.
  - a. **Western/Gymkhana:** No one-piece western eq-

uitation suits. Required attire must include a long-sleeved shirt or jacket; pants; western boots; and ASTM/SEI approved safety helmet. If button collar shirts are worn, ties, scarves, and pins are optional. Long-sleeve shirts may not be open in front more than one hand width from the base of the collarbone. Belts must be worn with any pants containing belt loops. Gloves may be worn. Vests may be worn over long-sleeved shirts. Short-sleeved or sleeveless shirts are allowed only if worn underneath a jacket. Dress chaps are permitted. Boots: soles, heels, and shape of toes on boots must allow for safe positioning in the stirrups.

**b. English:** No one-piece equitation suits or sweat-shirts may be worn. Required english attire must include a long-sleeved shirt; "rat-catcher" collar with pin or monogram, ties for males; breeches; belt (exception would be with english breeches which may not have belt loops); english boots; and ASTM/SEI approved safety helmet. Hunt coats are optional. Gloves may be worn. Solid color pullover v-neck or crew neck sweaters and vests are allowed. Short-sleeved or sleeveless shirts are allowed only if worn underneath a hunt coat. Half-chaps are permitted. Jodhpurs are permitted on exhibitors 9 or 10 years of age. Boots: soles, heels, and shape of toes on boots must allow for safe positioning in the stirrups.

#### c. Western Showmanship/Halter:

**4-H** - exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved white shirt (short-sleeved is acceptable but not desirable); 4-H tie or scarf; white, blue, or black pants; boots; belt (if pants have belt loops); and 4-H hat (green for juniors, white for seniors), ASTM/SEI approved safety helmet, or a white or off-white straw hat. Western felt hats are not allowed. Pants are to be worn outside the boots.

**FFA** - exhibitors must wear white or off-white pants or blue jeans; white shirt or blouse; the official FFA blue necktie or scarf; and boots. The official FFA jacket is optional.

**Independent** - exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt; tie, scarf, or pin; belt; pants; boots; and hat. No jacket or vests.

### Exhibitor Responsibilities

1. Exhibitors are required to handle, care for, prepare for showing and show their own animal at halter. Where it is impossible for an exhibitor to show all his/her own animals, he/she may be assisted only by a person who is entered as an exhibitor in this department. *Parents and leaders may intervene only in cases where the safety of the child or animal is involved.*

2. *There are no circumstances where a horse should require excessive discipline, abuse or punishment.* If a horse does become so out of control so as to warrant such action, it may be removed from the activity for the safety of all riders and horses. Abuse and punishment includes but is not limited to the following: excessive spurring in front of the cinch, the head or shoulders, or any excessive whip lashes, whether mounted or dismounted at any time, anywhere on the show grounds.
3. *No parents, trainers or other non-exhibitors are permitted to ride and/or handle project horses.* The exhibitor must show his/her own animal in all classes. For Halter classes only, when it is impossible for an exhibitor to show all their own animals, or in case of excusable absence, only someone who is entered as an exhibitor in this department may assist them.
4. Under no circumstances may an exhibitor ride another exhibitor's horse or pony on the Fair grounds. An exhibitor may assist another exhibitor with his or her horse, pony, or miniature horse with ground activities while the exhibitor who has entered the animal into the show is present and participating.
5. An exhibitor may not receive professional help in any capacity at any time on the fair grounds. This includes riding lessons and/or coaching from inside or outside of the arena.

## Classes

1. *Each Horse/pony owned by exhibitor must be shown in its proper halter class before it may be shown in any performance class or riding event. Exhibitors showing leased animals must show in appropriate showmanship classes as they are ineligible to show in halter classes. All exhibitors must enter at least one performance class.*
2. Classes with less than five entries may be combined or canceled at the discretion of the show management.
3. All non-pattern riding classes with more than 25 entries will be split and separate awards will be presented. Showmanship classes cannot be divided.
4. Each exhibitor and horse combination may enter only one age or performance level, i.e. 4-H Senior, FFA/Grange/Independent, Junior, Pony, Walk/Trot Open, Walk/Trot Novice, Green Horse, In-Hand, or Miniature Equine. May not cross enter divisions.
5. Ponies may be shown in Pony classes only. Ponies must be less than 14.2 hands and can be purebred or mixed pony breeds.
6. Performance classes will be judged according to United

States Equestrian Federation (USEF) rules. **Exception:** Snaffle bits/bosal hackamores are allowed in all Western classes regardless of horse's age. Riders should use two hands when using snaffle bits or bosal hackamores. Curb bits require the use of one hand only. Western bits with broken mouthpieces and shanks (i.e. Tom Thumb bits) are considered curb bits.

7. **English Riding Class:** Course will include simple lead changes and cavaletti. No jumps. Horse and rider combination to be judged. Course will be posted prior to class.
8. **Western Horsemanship:** Course will include a left and right lead, lope, jog, halt and back. Horse and rider combination to be judged with emphasis on correct form of both horse and rider while maintaining a pleasurable ride. Course will be posted prior to class.
9. **Trail Classes:** These classes will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Monday in the Cavalcade Arena. Please report to the Trail Judge as early as possible. *Each rider will be allowed only 3 (three) tries per obstacle.* Use all English or all Western tack/attire. *Do not mix.*
10. **Gymkhana:** Events will be judged according to the "California Gymkhana Association Rule Book." Patterns will be posted prior to the Gymkhana show. *Ropes or lariats are prohibited.* Any standard bit or hackamore (including mechanical) is permitted provided it's not considered severe by the judge or show management. Running or standing martingales and tie-downs are permitted. *Draw reins are not permitted.* Shin boots and bandages are permitted. All English or all Western tack and attire are required. *Do not mix.*
11. **In Hand Classes:** Not open to horses that are being shown in *any* riding events at this show. Member will wear attire appropriate to the class entered. All course work will be done at a walk and jog.
12. **Walk/Trot Open Classes:** Open to all riders; however, exhibitors choosing this level may only enter those classes designated as Walk/Trot Open or Walk/Jog Open. May not cross enter into canter classes or in-hand division classes. These classes are **qualifiers** for the State Fair County Fair Best of Show horse show when a matching class is offered.

### LEASED ANIMALS:

**Exhibitors showing leased animals must participate in appropriate Showmanship Classes to be eligible to ride in any Performance Classes.** Use age as of January 1, 2010, to determine which class to enter. Leased animals are **not eligible** to participate in Halter Classes.

All exhibitors, whether showing owned or leased animals, must enter at least one performance class in addition to their required halter or showmanship classes.

## EXHIBITOR OWNED ANIMALS:

All horses, ponies, mules, and other equines which are owned by exhibitors must be shown in their appropriate Halter Class prior to being shown in any performance class. **Missing the appropriate Halter Class will disqualify an animal from participating in any other classes.** Exhibitors showing owned animals may participate in Showmanship Classes, but it is not required.

13. **Walk/Trot Novice Classes:** Open only to those riders who are within their first or second year of showing at any show. May only enter those classes designated as Walk/Trot Novice or Walk/Jog Novice. May not cross enter into canter classes or in-hand division classes. These classes **do not** qualify for State Fair County Fair Best of Show horse show.
14. **Green Horse Classes:** Green Horse classes will be three-gaited classes (walk, jog/trot, and lope/canter) and are open only to horses and ponies that are within their first or second year of loping/cantering. May only enter those classes designated as Green Horse. May not cross enter into regular canter classes, walk/jog, or in-hand division classes. These classes **do not** qualify for the State Fair County Fair Best of Show horse show.
15. **Miniature Equines** may only enter appropriate Showmanship classes, Halter classes, and those Performance classes that are designated as Miniature Equine classes.
